1. Unlimited Rare Candy (Level Up Instantly)

If you want to boost your team without hours of battling, this cheat gives you 999 Rare Candies in your first item slot. Enter the following Action Replay code:

82025838 0001

After entering the code, check your Bag’s Items pocket. You’ll find Rare Candies there. Use them to instantly raise any Pokémon’s level. Be careful—overusing Rare Candies might cause your Pokémon to miss out on effort values (EVs), but for casual play, it’s fine.

2. Master Ball x99 (Catch Any Pokémon)

Master Balls never miss, making them perfect for capturing Legendary Pokémon. Use this GameShark code:

8202583C 0001

This will fill your first item slot with 99 Master Balls. You can then throw them at Mewtwo, Zapdos, or any roaming Pokémon without worrying about catch rates.

3. Walk Through Walls (Explore Unfinished Areas)

This Action Replay code lets you bypass obstacles and explore areas like the Cerulean Cave early. Use:

7881A4A9 2EB5F45E (enable)

E5B6CC7E 62132B84 (disable)

To activate, walk into any wall or obstacle. You'll phase through them. Disable the cheat when you want normal movement again. Avoid talking to NPCs while walking through walls to prevent softlocks.

4. Infinite Money (Shop Without Worry)

Tired of being broke? Use this Action Replay code to set your money to 999999:

820251E8 423F

Once activated, check your PokéDollars. You can now buy all the Poké Balls, Potions, and TMs you want.

5. Wild Pokémon Modifier (Catch Any Species, Including Mew)

This code changes the next wild Pokémon you encounter into a specific species. First, you need to set the encounter code. For example, to encounter a Mew (Pokémon #151):

83007F5C 0097

Then use a secondary code to activate the encounter. Walk into grass or use a Fishing Rod. The first Pokémon you encounter will be Mew (or whatever species you set). Note that some rare Pokémon may have unusual stats or movesets when encountered this way, but they are perfectly usable.

Advanced Cheats and Master Codes

Some **John GBA Fire Red cheats** require a “Master Code” to function properly. Master codes act as a gateway for other cheat codes. For Pokémon Fire Red (US version), the standard Master Code is:

8CC846B4 ABD5E0B5

You must add this code first, then add your secondary codes underneath. Without the Master Code, your cheats may not work or may cause random glitches. Always add the Master Code when using complex modifications like “Catch Any Pokémon” or “Trainer Rematches.”

Common Problems and How to Fix Them
