

How To Get From Cairns To Port Douglas

Similarly, returning from Port Douglas later in the afternoon can mean sharing the road with more traffic. If you are taking a shuttle, book the earliest departure if you have a flight to catch later in the day, as this gives you

What to Pack for the Journey
