

How To Jailbreak Apple Tv 3

Prerequisites: What You Need Before You Start

1. **An Apple TV 3 (either the 1080p or 720p model)** — the jailbreak works on both, but check your software version.
2. **A computer running macOS or Windows** — the jailbreak tool requires a desktop connection.
3. **Micro-USB cable** — to connect the Apple TV 3 to your computer (the original Apple TV 3 uses a micro-USB port on the back).
4. **Seas0nPass or an alternative tool** — the most popular and reliable method for Apple TV 3 jailbreak. You can download it from the FireCore website.
5. **Patience and backup** — ensure your media and settings are backed up. The jailbreak process may require a restore.

Important: The Apple TV 3 jailbreak is not persistent; after a reboot, your device may revert to a non-jailbroken state. Some tools offer “tethered” or “untethered” options. The Seas0nPass method creates a custom firmware that, once installed, remains jailbroken even after restarts.

Step-by-Step Guide: How to Jailbreak Apple TV 3

Follow these instructions carefully. The process involves creating a custom IPSW file and restoring it onto your Apple TV.

Step 1: Check Your Apple TV Software Version

Go to **Settings > General > About** on your Apple TV 3. Note the software version. The Seas0nPass tool supports up to a specific firmware version (typically Apple TV software 6.2.x is the latest jailbreakable version). If your device is running a newer version that isn't supported, you will not be able to jailbreak using this method. You may need to restore to an older firmware if Apple is still signing it, but that's unlikely. For most users, the version that came on the device is fine.

Step 2: Download and Install Seas0nPass

Visit the official FireCore website (or a trusted mirror) and download Seas0nPass for your operating system. Install the application. Launch it, and you'll see an interface with a single “Create IPSW” button. This button will download the necessary firmware from Apple and patch it to

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include the jailbreak.

Step 3: Create a Custom IPSW

Click "Create IPSW." Seas0nPass will automatically fetch the correct Apple TV firmware for your model. This process may take 10-15 minutes depending on your internet speed. Wait for it to finish. You will be prompted to save the IPSW file to your computer. Keep it in an easily accessible location.

Step 4: Put Your Apple TV into DFU Mode

DFU (Device Firmware Update) mode is required to restore the custom IPSW. Follow these steps exactly:

- Unplug the power cord from your Apple TV 3.
- Connect the micro-USB cable to your Apple TV and computer.
- Hold down the **Menu** and **Play/Pause** buttons on the Apple TV remote (Siri Remote will not work; use the aluminum remote that came with the device).
- While holding those buttons, plug the power cord back into the Apple TV.
- Continue holding the buttons for about 10 seconds, then release the **Play/Pause** button but keep holding the **Menu** button for another 5 seconds.
- Your computer should detect the Apple TV in DFU mode. On Windows, you may see a notification; on macOS, iTunes or Apple Configurator 2 may recognize it.

Step 5: Restore the Custom IPSW

Open iTunes (or Apple Configurator 2) on your computer. You should see a message that your Apple TV is in recovery mode and needs to be restored. Hold down the **Shift** key (Windows) or **Option** key (macOS) and click "Restore." Navigate to the IPSW file you created earlier. Select it and click "Open." iTunes will then restore your Apple TV using that custom firmware. This process takes a few minutes. Do not disconnect the cable or power during the restore.

Step 6: Complete the Jailbreak

Once the restore is finished, your Apple TV will reboot automatically. You should see the standard Apple setup screen. Complete the setup as usual. After the setup, if you go to the main menu, you'll notice a new icon: **FireCore's aTV Flash (black)** or simply a "nitoTV" icon depending on the tool version. This indicates your Apple TV 3 is now jailbroken. You can now install third-party apps, including Kodi, via the nitoTV installer.

Risks and Considerations Before Jailbreaking

While **how to jailbreak Apple TV 3** is straightforward, you should be aware of the downsides:

- **Warranty void:** Jailbreaking your device voids any remaining warranty from Apple.
- **Security vulnerabilities:** Custom firmware can expose your device to malware if you install untrusted apps.
- **System instability:** Some tweaks may cause crashes or reduced performance.
- **No official support:** If something goes wrong, Apple will not help. You may need to restore to stock firmware (which updates to the latest version, potentially losing jailbreak).

- **Upgrade to Apple TV 4K:** The newer Apple TV models support the tvOS App Store, which includes official versions of many media center apps like Plex and Infuse.

Troubleshooting Common Issues

- **My Apple TV won't enter DFU mode:** Make sure you're using the aluminum remote (not the Siri remote). Try a different micro-USB cable. Some cables are charge-only; you need a data cable.

- **Can I remove the jailbreak?** Yes, by restoring to the latest official Apple TV software via iTunes. However, you will lose all jailbreak apps and settings, and you cannot downgrade.

- **Install Kodi:** Through nitoTV, you can install the Kodi media center. This allows you to stream content from add-ons, network shares, and even local USB drives (if you use a USB adapter).
- **Enable file sharing:** Access the Apple TV's file system via SSH to transfer videos or tweaks.
- **Install other repositories:** Add third-party repos for more apps like movie trailers, weather, or games.
