- **Rez and Repair:** The iconic **Jeeves** and **MOLL-E** allow engineers to summon a repair bot and a mailbox anywhere in the world. Additionally, the **Gnomish Army Knife** and other tools provide a battle resurrection function, which is a massive boon for classes that otherwise lack one.
- **Mounts and Toys:** Engineering is the only profession that allows you to craft your own flying mounts, such as the **Flying Machine** and the **Turbo-Charged Flying Machine**. You also gain access to a host of fun toys like the **Birdcage**, **World Enlarger**, and various fireworks.
- **Gold Making Potential:** While not as straightforward as other professions, Engineers can craft sought-after mounts, pets, and boe (bind on equip) gear, especially at the start of an expansion. The **Engineering mount** market can be very lucrative.

Gnomish Engineering vs Goblin Engineering

At skill level 200, every engineer must make a critical choice: align with the ingenious but accident-prone **Gnomish Engineering** or the pragmatic and explosive **Goblin Engineering**. This specialization is permanent (though you can unlearn and re-learn it), so choose wisely. Each specialization offers exclusive schematics that define your Engineering experience.

Gnomish Engineering: The Art of Invention

Gnomish Engineering is characterized by gadgets that are quirky, unpredictable, and often backfire with comedic results. However, they offer some of the most powerful and unique utilities in the game. Key Gnomish exclusive items include:

- **Gnomish Battle Chicken:** A deployed mechanical chicken that provides a melee attack speed buff to the party. It is a trinket-slot item that can be extremely valuable for physical damage dealers.
- **Gnomish Death Ray:** A powerful channeled attack that deals massive fire damage to an enemy, but also damages the user. It is a high-risk, high-reward burst damage tool.
- **Gnomish Gravity Well:** Creates a gravitational anomaly that pulls enemies together, useful for dungeon packs or battlegrounds.
- **Pocket-Sized Computation Device:** A versatile gadget that can be used to manipulate the density of objects, though its exact functions vary by expansion.

Gnomish items are often more about creative problem-solving and raw utility than pure destruction. They are excellent for players who enjoy having a toolkit for every situation, even if sometimes it explodes in their face.

Goblin Engineering: The Power of Explosives

Goblin Engineering embraces the philosophy that if a problem cannot be solved with a sufficient amount of explosives, you are not using enough. Goblin schematics are more reliable, direct, and combat-focused. Key Goblin exclusive items include:

- **Goblin Rocket Launcher:** A ranged weapon that fires a rocket at an enemy, dealing significant fire damage. It is a great opener or finisher.
- **Goblin Sapper Charge:** A powerful area-of-effect explosive that is excellent for farming mobs or dealing burst damage in PvP.
- **Goblin Glider:** While a version of the glider is available to all engineers via the **Goblin Glider Kit** (made with Engineering and Tailoring), the Goblin exclusive version is a permanent item. The **Goblin Glider** allows you to deploy a parachute and glide across vast distances, a staple for world exploration and escaping danger.
- **Goblin Jumper Cables:** Used to revive a friendly target. The Goblin version has a higher success rate, though Gnomish also has a version. The **Ultimate Jumper Cables** are universally useful.
- **Goblin Rocket Boots:** While both specializations get versions, the Goblin ones are often considered more reliable for short bursts of speed.

Goblin Engineering is generally recommended for players who want straightforward combat power and reliable utility. It is the "meta" choice for endgame raiders and Mythic+ runners due to the consistent damage and mobility it provides.

Leveling Your Engineering Skill: A Step-by-Step Approach

Leveling Engineering can be expensive and time-consuming if you do not have a plan. Unlike gathering professions, you must craft items to gain skill points. Mining is the ideal companion profession, as Engineers rely heavily on ores

and stones. However, you can also buy materials from the Auction House. Here is a general guide for leveling Engineering from 1 to maximum skill in the current expansion (assuming Dragonflight or similar modern mechanics):

1-75: Apprentice Engineering

Start by crafting **Rough Blasting Powder** from **Rough Stone**. This is your bread and butter for the early levels. Once you cannot gain skill from that, move to **Rough Dynamite**. You will also want to craft **Copper Tubes** and **Copper Bolts** to bridge gaps. A good goal is to reach skill 50 quickly, then craft **Handful of Copper Bolts** up to 75.

75-150: Journeyman Engineering

Move into **Tin** and **Silver Ore**. Craft **Coarse Blasting Powder** and **Coarse Dynamite**. The classic path involves making **Skeleton Key** (if you need lockpicking for dungeons) or **Flywheels**. A reliable way to 150 is to craft **Heavy Blasting Powder** from **Heavy Stone** and then **Big Iron Bomb**.

150-200: Expert Engineering

This is where you start using **Mithril** and **Thorium**. Craft **Solid Blasting Powder** from **Solid Stone**. Then, move to **Mithril Casing** and **Mithril Tubes**. The **Mithril Heavy Bomber** blueprint is a good way to gain points. You will also craft **Unstable Trigger** at this stage. By the time you hit 200, you must choose your specialization (Gnomish or Goblin).

200-300: Artisan Engineering

Now you enter the **Thorium** range. Craft **Dense Blasting Powder** from **Dense Stone**. Then, focus on **Thorium Tube** and **Thorium Shells**. The **Goblin Sapper Charge** (if you are Goblin) is an excellent skill-up path. You can also craft **Arcane Bomb** for a boost. This range requires a significant amount of ore, so farming or buying in bulk is recommended.

300-375: Outland Engineering

Travel to the Hellfire Peninsula and learn from the trainer. You will use **Fel Iron** and **Adamantite**. Start with **Fel Iron**

Bomb and **Smokey Blasting Powder**. Then, move to **Adamantite Grenade** and **Adamantite Shells**. Crafting **White Smoke Flare** is also an easy way to gain points with minimal materials. This part is relatively straightforward.

375-450: Northrend Engineering

In Northrend, you will work with **Cobalt Ore** and **Saronite Ore**. Start with **Overcharged Capacitor** and **Cobalt Shield**. The main skill-up path involves **Explosive Decoy** and **Saronite Bomb**. **Gnomish Lightning Generator** (Gnomish) or **Goblin Beam Welder** (Goblin) are also good. Save your **Titanium Ore** for the final push to 450.

450-600: Cataclysm to Warlords Engineering

These expansions are often skipped in modern leveling guides, but they provide easy skill-ups. Use **Volatile Earth** and **Elementium** for Cataclysm, **Ghost Iron** for Mists of Pandaria, and **True Iron** for Warlords of Draenor. The **Gunpack** and **Gearspring Parts** are reliable crafts.

600-800: Legion and Battle for Azeroth Engineering

In Legion, you will use **Leystone Ore** and **Felslate**. In Battle for Azeroth, use **Monelite Ore** and **Storm Silver Ore**. Crafting **AZ3-R1 Tinker Gear** and **Level 3 components** will get you to 800. This is also where you
