- **Afternoon Juice:** Green Garden (2 cups romaine, 1 green apple, half cucumber, lemon juice, handful of parsley)
- **Evening Meal:** Vegetable stir-fry with bell peppers, snap peas, and brown rice
- **Pre-Bed Juice:** Chamomile Apple (1 apple, brewed chamomile tea cooled, dash of cinnamon)

Day 4: Deep Cleanse

- **Morning Juice:** Spicy Green (2 cups kale, 1 green apple, half jalapeño, lemon juice, 1 celery stalk)
- **Afternoon Juice:** Red Radiance (2 large red bell peppers, 2 tomatoes, 1 garlic clove, handful of basil)
