How to Obtain the Asurion Affidavit Att Form

- **Online Portal:** When you file a claim on the Asurion website, the system will automatically prompt you to download and sign the affidavit if your claim type requires one. You can usually download it as a PDF directly from your claim portal.

- Local banks and credit unions often offer free notary services for customers.
- UPS stores and other shipping centers have notaries on staff for a small fee.
- Your local AT&T store may have a notary available, though it is best to call ahead.
- Online notary services are becoming more common and are accepted by Asurion in many cases.

Step 6: Submit the Completed Affidavit

Once the document is notarized, you need to submit it to Asurion. You can upload it to your claim portal, email it to the address provided in your claim instructions, or fax it. Keep a copy of the completed and notarized affidavit for your records. This is your proof of compliance in case there is any dispute later.

Common Mistakes to Avoid
