

How To Logout Of Twitter

How to Log Out of Twitter on Mobile (iOS and Android App)

Logging Out of Twitter on iPhone (iOS)

1. Open the Twitter app on your iPhone or iPad.

Logging Out of Twitter on Android

1. Open the Twitter app on your Android device.
2. Tap your profile icon in the top-left corner to open the navigation drawer.
3. Tap **“Settings and privacy”** (gear icon) at the bottom of the drawer.
4. Tap **“Account”**.
5. Scroll down and tap **“Log out”**.
6. Confirm the action. The app will sign you out and return to the login page.

Android users may also find the logout option directly in the navigation drawer under the account switcher. Some versions of the app show a small three-dot menu next to your account name; tapping that reveals a **“Log out”** button. Check both locations.

How to Log Out of Twitter on Multiple Accounts or Switch Accounts

Issue: Forgot to Log Out on a Public Computer

If you left a public computer without logging out, immediately change your Twitter password from your phone or another device. This will automatically log out all sessions. Then enable two-factor authentication for extra protection. You can also revoke that specific session from

the "Sessions" page as described above.
