For knitting, **US size 15 (10 mm) or 17 (12 mm) needles** produce a fabric that is dense enough to be warm yet soft and drapey. Always check your gauge, but these sizes provide a good starting point.

Tips for Working with Fuzzy Yarn

1. **Use a smooth hook or needle.** Bamboo or polished metal helps the yarn glide without catching on the fur.
2. **Work in good lighting.** The fluff makes it hard to see individual stitches, so bright, direct light is essential.
3. **Count stitches frequently.** It is easy to accidentally add or drop stitches because the yarn obscures the stitch tops.
4. **Use stitch markers.** Place a marker at the beginning and end of each row to maintain straight edges.
5. **Consider using a larger hook than recommended.** This prevents the fabric from becoming too stiff and allows the softness to shine.

is still warm but has a bit more give. This stitch works up faster than single crochet, making it an excellent choice if you are short on time. Many crocheters find that the Bernat Pipsqueak baby blanket pattern using hdc creates a beautiful, squishy texture that babies love to snuggle.

The Garter Stitch Knitted Blanket

For knitters, garter stitch (knit every row) is the most straightforward approach. Because garter stitch produces a textured, reversible fabric, it complements the fuzzy nature of Pipsqueak perfectly. The ridges of garter stitch help anchor the fur, preventing the blanket from looking too flat. A Bernat Pipsqueak baby blanket pattern knit in garter stitch typically requires about four to five skeins, depending on size.

Striped or Color-Blocked Patterns

Bernat Pipsqueak comes in a variety of soft pastel shades, including baby pink, baby blue, mint green, lavender, and white. Alternating colors every few rows creates a striped effect that adds visual interest without requiring complex stitchwork. For a modern look, try a color-block design with two or three contrasting shades. Keep in mind that joining new colors in fuzzy yarn can be slightly tricky, so weave in ends securely and consider carrying the yarn up the side if the stripes are narrow.

Corner-to-Corner (C2C) Design

Although stitch definition is low with Pipsqueak, corner-to-corner crochet can still produce a lovely gradient or diagonal pattern. The C2C technique creates a fabric that grows diagonally, and the color changes add a subtle ombre effect. Many Bernat Pipsqueak baby blanket pattern designers have embraced C2C because it works well with the yarn's bulk and creates a modern, graphic look even with minimal stitch visibility.

Sizing Your Baby Blanket

Baby blankets come in several standard sizes, and the Bernat Pipsqueak baby blanket pattern can be easily adapted to any of them. Here are the most common dimensions:

- **Receiving blanket:** 24 by 24 inches, ideal for newborns and for swaddling.

Adding Borders and Edges

Because Bernat Pipsqueak has limited stitch definition, traditional scalloped or picot borders can be challenging. Simpler edgings work best. A single round of single crochet in a contrasting color creates a clean, finished look. Alternatively, you can work a row of slip stitches along the edge for a subtle, polished border. If you want a more decorative edge, consider using a smooth yarn for the border, such as Bernat Baby Blanket or a worsted weight cotton. The contrast in texture between the fluffy Pipsqueak and the smooth border creates a lovely visual effect.

Also, inserting the tool directly under the V of the stitch rather than through the center of the loop helps keep the strands together.

Frogging (Ripping Out) the Yarn

to pull out stitches. If possible, avoid frogging by checking your stitch count regularly. If you must rip out a row, do it slowly and gently to avoid tangling or breaking the yarn.
