If the engine continues to run for more than 30 seconds after you exit, or if the parking lights do not flash, the procedure may not have been followed correctly. Return to the vehicle, turn the key to the On position, re-set the parking brake, and try again.

Programming Your Prestige Remote

If you purchase a new remote or need to reprogram your existing ones after a battery disconnection, you will need to enter the programming mode. This process typically uses the valet button.

Standard Remote Programming Procedure

- Sit in the driver's seat and close the door.
- Turn the ignition key to the **On** position (the dashboard lights come on, but the engine does not start).
- Press and release the **Valet/Program Button** a specific number of times (often three or five times, depending on the model). You may hear a chirp from the siren.
- Turn the ignition key to the **Off** position. The siren will chirp and the parking lights will flash to confirm you are in programming mode.
- On the first remote, press and hold the **Lock** button for two seconds. The siren will chirp once. Then, press and hold the **Remote Start** button for two seconds. The siren will chirp twice.
- Release both buttons. The siren will chirp one more time to confirm the remote is stored.
- Repeat step 5 for any additional remotes.
- Turn the ignition key to the **Off** position to exit programming mode. The parking lights will flash three times to confirm the process is complete.
