The final boss fight takes place on top of Federal Hall. Solidus wields two P90s and a powerful sword. He is fast and aggressive. Your best bet is to use the M9 or the SOCOM to stun him, then close in for melee attacks. Alternatively, you can use grenades to create distance and chip away at his health. Unlike earlier bosses, Solidus requires a combination of stealth and direct combat. Use the statues and pillars as cover to avoid his machine gun fire.

Secrets, Easter Eggs, and Bonus Content
