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Trophy Hunting

To avoid unnecessary frustration, adopt a few core strategies from the very beginning. First, **always prioritize your rice farming**. The quality of your rice directly affects Sakuna's stats, which makes later combat encounters and exploration much easier. Second, **manage your save files wisely**. While most trophies are not missable, having a backup save before a major decision or a long farming season can save you hours of backtracking.

Another important tip is to **explore every nook and cranny** of each stage. Many collectibles, such as secret items and new recipes, are hidden off the main path. Finally, **do not ignore the offering stand at the start of each level**.

Story-Related Trophies: The Journey of a Harvest Goddess

These trophies are earned simply by progressing through the main story. You cannot miss them, so relax and enjoy the narrative. Key milestones include defeating the major bosses guarding each region and advancing the seasonal cycle. The story naturally leads you to the final boss, at which point you will have unlocked the majority of the progression-based trophies.

However, note that the story does not end after the credits. A post-game chapter opens up, unlocking new areas, harder enemies, and the final batch of farming upgrades. All story-related trophies are unmissable, but one specific trophy requires you to complete the entire post-game story as well. This is the true ending, and it is a prerequisite for the platinum.

Combat and Boss Trophies: Sharpening Your Divine Tools

Combat in **Sakuna: Of Rice and Ruin** is fluid and requires you to master your divine raiments (silk threads) and farming tools. The trophy list includes several objectives tied to specific

combat feats.

Defeating Major and Hidden Bosses

Beyond the main story bosses, there are optional super-bosses hidden in the most dangerous regions. These encounters require flawless execution and a well-seasoned Sakuna. The toughest optional boss is the Phantom of the Deep, which you can only access by fully exploring the final hidden cave. Make sure you have upgraded your health, attack, and rice quality to the maximum before attempting these fights. Using strong defensive foods from the offering stand is highly recommended.

Combo and Style Trophies

Some trophies reward you for achieving a high

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~~combo count or using specific combat~~ techniques. The most important one to be aware of is the "Flawless" trophy, which requires you to clear a stage without taking damage. The best stage for this is the very first area of the game on New Game+ or after you have significantly overleveled. Equip high-defense offerings and use the spinning sickle attack to clear enemies quickly while staying mobile. Patience is key here.

Another challenging combat trophy is "The Legendary Warrior," which requires you to defeat 1000 total enemies. This will come naturally through normal play and farming runs, but if you need to grind, replay the cave of trials stages in the post-game for dense enemy spawns.

Deep in the Fields: The Rice Farming Trophies

This is the heart of the game and the source of the most complex trophies. Your success as a farmer is measured by the quality of your rice, which is represented by a letter grade from F to S+. The **Sakuna Of Rice And Ruin farming trophies** are the true test of your agricultural skill.

To achieve the highest quality rice, you must master every step of the process:

- **Soil Preparation:** Ensure your soil is balanced by adding fertilizers that boost specific stats like "Leaf," "Stem," "Root," and "Harvest." Use the "Taste" stat to

raise the overall flavor.

- **Water Level Management:** Keep the water depth appropriate for each growth stage. Too much or too little water will stunt growth.
- **Weeding and Pests:** Remove weeds and bugs manually every day. Pests and weeds reduce yield and quality.
- **Thinning and Transplanting:** Proper spacing between seedlings is critical to avoid competition.
- **Harvesting and Drying:** Use the correct tool to harvest, then dry the rice bundles on racks. The drying duration affects the final taste.
- **Winnowing, Threshing, and Polishing:** Perform these steps carefully. The polishing percentage

directly impacts the final grade.

The "Master Farmer" trophy requires you to produce rice of the highest quality (S+ rank) in any single season. This usually takes multiple in-game years of practice and unlocking better fertilizer recipes. Use the nature journal to track your mistakes and adjust your technique each season. Do not rush this process; it is the most rewarding aspect of the game.

Additionally, there are trophies for harvesting a certain number of rice plants, reaching level 50 in your divine status, and fully upgrading your house. All of these are tied to the sustainable cycle of farming and combat.

To complete your trophy collection, you need to find every hidden item and complete every side activity.

Lost Items and Treasures

Throughout the various stages, you will find lost items that belong to Sakuna's divine family. Returning these items unlocks new recipes, outfits, and building upgrades. There are 14 lost items in total. Most are hidden in hard-to-reach areas that require upgrading your divine raiment (such as the ability to grapple to further distances). Exploration is also tied to the "Treasure Hunter" trophy, which requires you

Recipes and Outfits

You can unlock a wide variety of outfits and hairstyles for Sakuna by completing specific quests, finding lost items, and achieving milestones in your farming. These are purely cosmetic, but collecting them all unlocks a trophy. Similarly, learning every cooking recipe requires you to experiment with different ingredients at the cooking pot. The best approach is to grow every type of vegetable and catch every fish at least once, then combine ingredients systematically.

Pet Trophies

You can tame small animals and insects that live on the farm. Catching and taming one of each species (mice, birds, insects) is required for one trophy. These creatures provide small benefits to the farm, such as weed control. Use the bug net and the capture mechanic without harming them to add them to your collection.

Roadmap to the Platinum Trophy

If you want the most efficient path to the platinum, follow this roadmap:

1. **First Playthrough (Focus on Story):**
Play through the main story and post-

game at a natural pace. Do not stress about rice quality above A rank yet. Focus on learning the farming mechanics, finding lost items, and unlocking all stages. Complete all side quests as they appear.

2. **Post-Game Cleanup:** After the true ending, defeat the remaining super-bosses and complete any outstanding combat trophies. Use this time to max out your divine status by repeatedly farming high-quality rice.
3. **Master the Farm:** Dedicate several in-game years to perfecting your rice. Use the best fertilizers, study the nature journal, and aim for that S+ rank. This will also naturally unlock the remaining farming and level trophies.

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4. **Mopping Up:** Use a guide to locate any lost treasures, recipes, outfits, or pets you missed. This is usually the fastest phase. The game does not have a New Game Plus requirement, but you can continue forever after the story to finish everything.

Many players got stuck on the farming trophies because they overlook the nuances of soil chemistry. The most common mistake is neglecting to use fertilizer early in the season. Fertilizer should be applied right after transplanting and again during the booting stage for best results. Another pitfall is harvesting too early or too late; the rice must be the correct golden-brown color before you cut it.

For combat, players often underestimate the importance of the offering stand. Never
