La Romana International Airport (LRM): The Obvious First Choice

As the name suggests, La Romana International Airport is the nearest and most convenient airfield for anyone heading to La Romana, Bayahibe, or the southeastern resorts. Located just a short drive from the city center and the Casa de Campo resort complex, this airport offers unparalleled convenience.

Distance and Location

La Romana International Airport is approximately **4.5 miles (7.2 kilometers)** from the center of La Romana. For travelers staying at Casa de Campo, the drive is often less than 10 minutes. If you are heading to the popular beach town of Bayahibe, famous for its diving and access to Isla Saona, the drive is roughly 20 to 25 minutes. This proximity makes LRM the undisputed champion for proximity and speed.

Airlines and Destinations

While LRM is smaller than the major international hubs like Punta Cana (PUJ) or Las Américas (SDQ), it is well-served by several major carriers, particularly from North America and Europe. You will find regular and seasonal flights from:

- Canada:** Air Canada Rouge and Sunwing Airlines offer seasonal flights.
- United States:** American Airlines operates flights from Miami (MIA) and sometimes Charlotte (CLT). Delta Air Lines also offers seasonal service. JetBlue has operated flights from New York (JFK) and Boston (BOS).
- Europe:** Several charter airlines, such as TUI Airways and Neos, connect LRM with the United Kingdom, Germany, and Italy.
- Regional:** Air Century and other regional carriers may offer connections from other Caribbean islands, though these are less frequent.

Facilities and Services

Do not let the airport's smaller size deceive you. La Romana International Airport is modern, clean, and surprisingly efficient. It features a single terminal that is easy to navigate. The arrival experience is often rated highly because it is less crowded than the larger airports. Services include:

- Duty-free shops
- Currency exchange
- Car rental desks (Avis, Hertz, Europcar, and local providers)
- VIP lounge access
- On-site parking for those picking up guests

The biggest advantage here is the speed of baggage claim and customs. You can often be out of the airport and in a taxi within 30 to 45 minutes of landing, a stark contrast to the longer waits at Punta Cana or Santo Domingo.

Who Should Fly into LRM?

If you can find a direct flight that fits your schedule, LRM is the best choice for almost everyone heading to La Romana, Bayahibe, or even the eastern parts of the capital region. It is particularly ideal for:

- Guests staying at Casa de Campo
- Travelers heading to Bayahibe or Dominicus
- Golfers looking to maximize time on the course
- Anyone who values a quick, hassle-free arrival

Punta Cana International Airport (PUJ): The Busy Regional Hub

If you cannot find a convenient flight into LRM, Punta Cana International Airport (PUJ) is your next best bet. Located roughly 43 miles (69 kilometers) east of La Romana, PUJ is one of the busiest airports in the Caribbean and serves millions of tourists annually.

Distance and Travel Time

The drive from Punta Cana International Airport to La Romana takes approximately **45 minutes to 1 hour and 15 minutes**, depending on traffic and your specific destination. You will take the main highway, Autopista del Coral (Highway 3), which is in good condition. The distance to Bayahibe from PUJ is slightly shorter, often around 45 minutes.

Airlines and Connectivity

Punta Cana is a major international hub with far more flight options than LRM. Virtually every major airline in North America, Europe, and Latin America flies into PUJ. This includes American Airlines, Delta, United, Southwest, JetBlue, Air France, British Airways, Copa, and many more. This broad connectivity often makes PUJ a more practical choice for travelers coming from smaller cities or looking for cheaper fares.

Facilities at Punta Cana Airport

PUJ is a sprawling, open-air airport with several terminals (A, B, and a newer terminal for domestic/regional flights). It is known for its palm-thatched roofs and tropical feel. Facilities are extensive:

- Numerous duty-free shops and boutiques
- Multiple restaurants and bars
- Currency exchange and ATMs
- Major car rental agencies
- VIP lounges
- Free Wi-Fi

The downside to PUJ is the volume. During peak hours, customs and baggage claim can take 45 minutes to two hours. However, the airport is well-organized and efficient given its size.

Who Should Fly into PUJ?

Punta Cana is a fantastic alternative if:

- There are no direct flights to LRM from your departure city.
- You find significantly cheaper airfare to PUJ.
- You plan to visit both La Romana and Punta Cana during your trip.
- You are comfortable with a short (under 90-minute) transfer.

Las Américas International Airport (SDQ): The Santo Domingo Option

Another viable alternative, depending on your itinerary, is Las Américas International Airport (SDQ) in Santo Domingo. This airport serves the capital city and is located to the west of La Romana.

Distance and Travel Time

The distance from SDQ to La Romana is about **46 miles (74 kilometers)** as the crow flies, but the actual road distance is closer to 55 miles (89 km) due to the route. The drive typically takes between **1 hour and 1 hour 30 minutes** via the Autopista del Coral (Highway 3) going east. Traffic around Santo Domingo can be heavy, especially during peak commuting hours, which can add significant time to your journey.

Airlines and Connectivity

SDQ is a major hub with extensive international and regional connections. It is the primary base for the Dominican airline Sky High Aviation and serves as a focus city for Arajet. Airlines operating here include:

- American Airlines (Miami, New York)
- Delta (Atlanta, New York)
- United (Newark, Houston)
- Air France (Paris)
- Iberia (Madrid)
- Copa Airlines (Panama City)
- JetBlue (multiple US cities)
- Spirit Airlines (Fort Lauderdale)

Facilities at SDQ

SDQ is a modern airport with two main terminals. It offers a full range of services, including shops, restaurants, lounges, and car rental counters. The airport is generally well-maintained, but like Punta Cana, it can experience congestion, particularly in the arrivals area.

Who Should Fly into SDQ?

Consider Las Américas if:

- You plan to spend time in Santo Domingo before heading to La Romana.
- You are arriving from a destination not served by LRM or PUJ.
- You have a strong preference for a specific airline that only flies to SDQ.
- You are comfortable with a slightly longer drive.

Other Potential Arrival Points

While less common, there are other airports in the region that could be used, though they are generally less convenient.

Samaná El Catey International Airport (AZS)

Samaná Airport is located north of La Romana, on the Samaná Peninsula. The distance is roughly 80 miles (130 km), but the drive crosses the mountains and can take over 2.5 hours. While scenic, it is rarely the best choice for reaching La Romana unless you are combining a trip to the Samaná region.

La Isabela International Airport (JBQ)

This airport in Santo Domingo primarily handles domestic and regional flights. It is not a practical option for most international travelers coming to La Romana, as it does not handle large commercial jets.

Transportation: Getting from Airport to La Romana

Once you have decided on your arrival airport, you need to plan your transfer. Here are the most common options:

Private Transfers

This is the most popular and hassle-free choice. Companies like Viator, TripAdvisor, and local operators offer pre-booked private transfers. A driver will meet you at the arrivals hall with a sign, help with your luggage, and drive you directly to your hotel. This is particularly recommended for families and groups. The cost is reasonable, and the peace of mind is unbeatable.

Rental Cars

All three major airports (LRM, PUJ, SDQ) have rental car desks. Driving in the Dominican Republic is generally safe but can be chaotic for inexperienced visitors. The main highways are well-maintained, but local driving habits and signage may be challenging. If you plan to explore extensively, a rental car offers the most flexibility. Just be sure to check your insurance coverage carefully.

Taxis

Taxis are available at all airports. However, it is strongly recommended to use the official taxi stands or airport-authorized services. Negotiate the fare before departing. Prices are standardized in many cases, but it is always best to confirm. Taxis from LRM are very affordable; from PUJ, expect a higher flat rate to La Romana.

Buses and Shuttles

Public bus service between the airports and La Romana is limited. While there are intercity buses from Santo Domingo to La Romana, this is not a practical option for most tourists due to luggage and convenience. Private shuttles are a better shared-ride alternative.
