1. Zelda’s Lullaby

This gentle, soothing theme is arguably the easiest entry point. It uses only white keys in the key of C major, with a slow tempo and a predictable phrase structure. The right hand carries the melody with stepwise intervals, while the left hand plays simple whole-note chords. Mastering "Zelda’s Lullaby" builds your confidence in hand coordination and legato playing.

2. Song of Storms

Instantly recognizable by its minor-key descending pattern, the "Song of Storms" is a lively piece that introduces basic dotted rhythms and dynamic contrasts. It stays entirely on the white keys and repeats the same two-phrase structure, making it easy to memorize. The left hand pattern is repetitive, allowing you to focus on articulation.

3. Fairy Fountain

The magical, arpeggiated feel of "Fairy Fountain" sounds more complex than it is. Start with the Melody Alone
