Shampoodle Salon

How to Unlock Shampoodle

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- **Wait for Gracie's first fashion check.** You need to have the T&T Emporium upgrade, which requires Gracie to visit your town four times. The first check is enough to trigger the Shampooodle upgrade.
- **Have the update (Welcome amiibo) or specific game version.** In the original game, you had to wait for the upgrade. With the Welcome amiibo update, the process remains the same, but the salon is always a separate building next to the Able Sisters.

Once these conditions are met, you will see a new building under construction next to the Able Sisters. After a day, it will open, and you can finally start

experimenting with your Animal Crossing New Leaf hair guide color options.

Understanding the Hair Color Palette

The Shampooodle salon offers a vast array of colors. However, not all colors are available from the start. The base game provides a selection of natural and fantasy hues, while the **Welcome amiibo** update added even more shades. Here is the full spectrum of colors you can choose from, broken down by category for easier navigation.

Natural Hair Colors

These are the classic, everyday colors that you might see in real life. They are perfect for players who want a more grounded, realistic look for their mayor.

- **Black:** A deep, jet-black shade. Very sleek and classic.
- **Brown:** A standard medium brown, warm and versatile.
- **Dark Brown:** A richer, darker brown closer to espresso.
- **Blonde:** A bright, sunny yellow-blond.
- **Strawberry Blonde:** A warm blonde with reddish undertones, almost a light copper.
- **Red:** A vibrant, classic ginger or auburn red.

- **Grey:** A soft, silver-grey perfect for an older or distinguished character.
- **White:** A pure, stark white, almost like an anime character's hair.

Fantasy and Vibrant Hair Colors

This is where the fun really begins. **Animal Crossing: New Leaf** allows you to fully embrace your wild side with a rainbow of unnatural colors. These are the most popular choices in any **Animal Crossing New Leaf hair guide color** discussion.

- **Pink:** A bright, bubblegum pink. Very popular for cute-themed towns.
- **Purple:** A rich, deep violet or plum shade.
- **Blue:** A vibrant, electric blue. A fan

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favorite.

- **Green:** A bright, lime green or emerald shade.
- **Orange:** A bold, tangerine orange. Bright and zesty.
- **Yellow:** A neon, almost highlighter yellow. Very striking.

Special Colors (Post-Welcome amiibo)

If you have updated your game to the **Welcome amiibo** version, you unlock access to even more specialized shades. These are often tied to specific hairstyles or are simply rarer to see.

- **Pastel Pink:** A softer, more muted version of pink, very dreamy.
- **Pastel Blue:** A light, sky blue

shade.

- **Pastel Purple:** A lavender-like, gentle purple.
- **Mint Green:** A cool, refreshing pastel green.
- **Dark Red:** A deeper, more wine-like red than the standard red.
- **Dark Blue:** A navy or midnight blue, almost black but with blue tones.
- **Dark Purple:** A very deep, regal purple.

How to Change Your Hair Color at Shampoodle

Once the salon is open, changing your hair is simple. Speak to **Harriet**, the poodle

who runs the shop. She will offer you a chair and ask if you want a haircut or a color change. You can do both in the same visit, but you cannot change the style and color separately without paying twice.

When selecting a color, Harriet will show you a palette of possible shades. You can scroll through the options using the D-pad or touchscreen. The current **Animal Crossing New Leaf hair guide color** system offers a circular selection grid. The color you choose is applied instantly, and you will see your character's new look in the mirror.

Cost: A hairstyle change costs 3,000 Bells. A color change costs 2,000 Bells. If you do both in one visit, you pay 5,000 Bells total.

Important Note: You cannot change your hair color if you are wearing a hat, helmet, or any head accessory that covers your hair. Also, you cannot change your hair if you have a tan from the island, or if you have a mii mask on. Remove all headwear before sitting in the chair.

Match Your Eye Color

Your eye color in the game is fixed (unless you use a save editor), but you can work with it. Brown eyes look great with warm hair colors like blonde, strawberry blonde, or brown. Blue eyes pop with cool tones like blue, purple, or grey. Green eyes are incredibly versatile.

Outfits

If you wear a lot of bright colors (like pink or yellow clothing), a neutral hair color like brown or black might balance the look. If you wear a lot of dark or neutral clothing, a vibrant hair color like blue or pink can be a great accent piece.

Don't Be Afraid to Experiment

The beauty of **Animal Crossing: New Leaf** is that you can change your hair as often as you want (provided you have the Bells). Try a new color every week! You can even match your hair to the current season. Green for spring, orange for fall, white for winter, and blue for summer.

Hair Styles and How They Work With Color

Color is only half the equation. The hairstyle you choose dramatically affects how the color looks. A short, spiky cut will show off a bright color more intensely than a long, flowing style. Similarly, a braided style will display the color in a more textured way.

Base Game Hairstyles

The original game offers a variety of styles based on your character's gender (male or female). You have access to short cuts, ponytails, buns, and more. Each style has a default look that changes with the color

you pick.

Welcome amiibo Hairstyles

This update added a massive 30 new hairstyles for both genders. These include modern cuts like the undercut, long wavy hair, double buns, and more. These styles often have better color gradients and highlights, making your chosen **Animal Crossing New Leaf** hair guide color look even more polished.

Frequently Asked Questions About Hair Color

Can I get my hair color back if I don't like it?

Yes! You can always go back to Shampoodle and change it again. If you want to revert to your natural starting color, you can also use a **Mirror** item in your house. The mirror allows you to change your hairstyle and color for free, but only to the options you have previously unlocked at Shampoodle.

Does my hair color affect anything else in the game?

Can I change my hair color at another player's town?

Yes! If you visit a friend's town and they have a Shampoodle salon, you can use it. The cost is the same, but this is a great way to get a new color if your own salon is not yet unlocked or if you want a change of scenery.

Is there a way to get special

colors without the **Welcome amiibo** update?

No. The pastel and dark shades are exclusive to the **Welcome amiibo** update. If you are playing the original game without the update, you are limited to the base 10 or so colors.

Beyond the Salon: Wigs and Headgear

While the **Animal Crossing New Leaf hair guide color** system is robust, sometimes you want a complete look without the commitment. Wigs are a fantastic alternative. You can purchase wigs from the Able Sisters' shop or get them from special events. Wigs come in various colors and styles, and they completely cover your natural hair color.
