

What Tape Is Clay On In 13 Reasons Why

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If you have watched the Netflix series **13 Reasons Why**, you know that the story revolves around a set of cassette tapes recorded by Hannah Baker before her suicide. Each tape is dedicated to a person she holds responsible for her decision to end her life. - **Tape 7, Side A (or the 13th side):** The list itself (Reason 13)

So, to answer the question directly: **Clay is on Tape 5, Side B** — the tenth reason. This placement is significant because it places Clay in the middle of the sequence, yet his story is arguably the most heartbreaking and revealing of the entire set.

Why Does the Tape Order Matter?

The order of the tapes is not random. Hannah arranged her reasons in a way that builds a timeline of events leading to her suicide. Each person's actions, whether deliberate or accidental, contributed to a chain reaction of pain.
